are some newly restored masterpieces of Italian cinema including Paolo and Vittorio Taviani's *Padre Padrone* and Pietro Germi's *In Nome della Legge*.

For all of you waiting to hear about this year's 14 Close Encounters series, buckle up, as some prominent names in the film industry will be involved. From director Steve McQueen who's going to present *Small Axe*, a series of 5 films set in London in between the '60s and '70s; to American director, screenwriter, animator and film producer Pete Docter, who has enchanted the public with animation jewels such as *Up*, *Monsters & Co*. and *Inside Out*. But that's not it, other personalities that aren't linked to the film industry will also be present: from Radiohead's lead singer Thom York to Francesco Totti whose film *Mi chiamo Francesco Totti* directed by Alex Infascelli will premiere at the Festival.

While the retrospective, curated by Mario Sesti, will be dedicated to the Indian film director Satyajit Ray, considered one of the greatest filmmakers in the history of cinema.

As usual, the festival will take place in various locations in Rome. After last year's success the two formars: "Duel" and "Fedeltà/Tradimenti" will make a comeback. In "Duel" two well-known personalities will compare divergent opinions on themes related to cinema, while in "Fedeltà/Tradimenti" acclaimed Italian and international screenwriters will comment on the cinematographic transposition of famous literary works.

After last year's screwball comedies, this year's edition of "Films of our Lives" will be about science fiction. Before each screening, viewers will be able to watch short clips of the most famous science fiction films. Seven films are in store, including *Star Wars: Episode Iv - A New Hope* and *Close Encounters Of The Third Kind*.

Other big news is the debut of the new virtual room where you can follow part of the program on demand: the Digital RFF15 platform, which will be online starting from October 12th. Check out the whole program by visiting the Festival's official website.

Museo nazionale delle arti del XXI secolo

MAXXI, the National Museum of 21st Century Arts, hosts thought-provoking and colorful exhibitions from the modern art world. Designed by controversial architect Zaha Hadid, MAXXI is an unconventional space both inside and out. This striking building is composed of giant intersecting concrete segments that seem severe from the outside, but inside create flowing pathways that gently transport the visitor through this modern, open-plan space.

MAXXI is always an eye and mind-opening experience every person must experience. Founded in 1998 by the Ministry for Cultural Heritage and Activities, the museum offers a panoramic overview of contemporary art through its permanent Collection, art and architecture exhibitions, workshops, conferences and educational projects. This month, the big news is the enrichment of the permanent Collection with artworks by nine Italian masters and the stunning photographic exhibition by Giovanni Gastel.

Giovanni Gastel. The People I Like

Admire Giovanni Gastel's superb photography exhibition, 'The People I Like' on display till November 22nd. Gastel has captured over 200 figures in elegant shots and displayed the essence of human emotions and identity in just a few camera clicks, in a few fleeting moments. These "celebrities" are captured as transient and as natural as strangers on the metro. All sense of career or status is lost, instead we are immersed in their emotions. For instance, we notice Barack Obama in a single instant, laughing, his face creased with sheer joy. Or Toni Thorimbert's sharp



eyes scorching the camera lens. Appreciate the contrasting photographic techniques, some portraits in black in white, others bursting with colour, some hiding behind messy hair or hats. Others are up close, each eyelash and wrinkle depicted in the finest clarity.

SENZAMARGINE. Passages In Italian Art At The Turn Of The Millennium

Carla Accardi, Luciano Fabro, Luigi Ghirri, Yervant Gianikian and Angela Ricci Lucchi. Paolo Icaro, Jannis Kounellis, Anna Maria Maiolino, Claudio Parmiggiani and Mario Schifano—these nine masters of Italian contemporary art are the protagonists of the new tribute exhibition Senzamargine. Set in a sequence of immersive environments that enhance their revolutionary charge, strength and monumentality. as well as their relationship with space, the chosen works created by Italian masters, or active in Italy, are often considered to be on the margins of the most well known movements. Over the years these artists



have been able to maintain independent and original research, such as to be considered a reference point for the artists of subsequent generations. This new large display of artworks enriches MAXXI's Collection project on the occasion of the Museum's tenth anniversary.



BANKSY A VISUAL PROTEST

British street artist and superstar Banksy has returned to Rome with an exhibition at Chiostro del Bramante displaying 90 of the artist's works. Banksy is a contradiction of fame and mystery, with anonymity at the core of his identity he is one of the most influential characters of the art world. Graffiti is illegal so secrecy is a defence against the police, but it also makes space to confront his controversial themes of war, politics and decaying society without his personality distracting or diluting the discussion.

The exhibition is expansive, curated over two floors in a labyrinth of grey rooms which evoke the meandering mess of city streets. The historic architecture of Bramante's Cloister compliments Banksy's urban street art with the notion that all art is contemporary, graffiti as an evolution of Renaissance frescoes. Most of the work on display has come from private collectors, so it is a rare moment to see so much of Banksy's art in one place. From "Love is in the Air" and "Girl with Balloon": from "Queen Vic" to "Napalm", from "Toxic Mary" to "HMV", and even prints made for Barely Legal. The exhibition itinerary also includes more than 20 projects for album and book covers, in a time span that ranges from 2001 to 2017. Banksy is a genius of comedy who incites change and provokes rebellion. Actress

Angela Rafanelli narrates their audio quide on the gallery app to ensue you don't miss a thing.
