RUN ROME THE MARATHON

Not for the faint of heart, the 29th edition of the Rome Marathon will cover the usual 26 miles and the route will start and finish at the Fori Imperiali. The race will circle around the Vittoriano, Piazza Venezia and Circo Massimo, zig-zaging across the Lungotevere, Castel Sant'Angelo and Via della Conciliazione. Runners will pass by major monuments such as St. Peter's Basilica and Piazza del Popolo. If you're looking for a lighter workout, you can register for the non-competitive Fun Run (5 kilometers). Runners also have the option to partake in the relay race Run4Rome.



SIX NATIONS RUGBY CHAMPIONSHIP

The annual 6 Nations Rugby Championship has started in February 2024. Six elite rugby nations — Italy, England, Scotland, Wales, Ireland, and France — are going head-to-head in this hundred-year-old tradition, and just like the Ancient Romans, these rugby warriors are fighting to the death, or rather to the trophy. Italy has hosted England on February 3rd at Rome's Stadio Olimpico this 2024 and Scotland on March 9th. Watch the players roar, claw, and run to victory. Be prepared for fans to swarm into pubs after the games for the legendary "third half," known to be a time of copious drinking and celebration of rugby, no matter which team won or lost.



MARCH MARKETS

SHOPPING, VINTAGE

This March in Rome, visitors and locals alike can enjoy a variety of markets throughout the city. Vintage markets are popular, such as the Vintage Market on March 16-17. which changes location from Ragusa Off to San Paolo District. At Città dell'Altra Economia, every Sunday you'll find the Car Boot Market, a market where items are displayed from the trunk of a car.



For those interested in the world of handicrafts, on March 10 head to the Eco & Chic Market at Piazza dell'Immacolata. If you're into eco-sustainability, there are markets that feature environmentally-friendly products, such as the Anima Verde Market taking place at Città dell'Altra Economia every Sunday. A Japanese market at Atlantico Live offers a glimpse into Japanese culture, with food, art, and other products on March 9-10.

Artisans will be displaying their wares at made-in-Italy markets, like the Brayura Bay at Condominio Marconi on March 10. Alongside the regular market, there will be a Swapping Day event where you can bring pieces of clothing to exchange with items from fellow participants. For a unique market experience accompanied by live music, make your way to Vinyl Village at Monk Roma on March 9. And don't miss the weekly market at Alcazar Live, an artisan and handmade market with music, brunch and DJ set.

Ever wonder what's happening on a slow Tuesday night in Rome? Ever wanted to go out but you just have no idea of what's going on and where? Well, let's see if this article can help you out.

Let's start with the saddest day of the week—**Monday**. Mondays have always been the one night a week where you just want to stay home, but for those looking for some excitement, for those who just broke up with their girlfriend and don't want to mope around or if you simply don't want to stay in your hotel room then we suggest checking out the parties organized by **Any Given Monday** (@agmonday). AGM has been around for 15 years and it's a staple in Rome's nightlife. The parties are held at Teatro Centrale, a venue in the heart of Rome on Via Celsa 6, near Piazza Venezia. The parties usually start around 11pm and end at 4am. Keep in mind the age range for the AGM events are usually in the mid-to-early twenties but beggars can't be choosers, especially on a Monday night.

Next up we have **Tuesday**. Here we suggest you check out **Baronato Quattro Bellezze**, a very interesting art gallery that hosts parties ONLY on Tuesday nights from 7pm to midnight. This place is a mysterious tavern where music and drinks go hand in hand, a definitely must-see at the moment. This venue is also located in the center on Via Di Panico 23, a 10-minute walk from the Vatican.

Next up we have our beloved **Wednesday**—on this day we suggest you check out **Lost In Events** (@Lostinevents) as they organize a nice evening out every Wednesday night but always in a different location. They have been around for a few years, the music is great, and the venues are always fun.

Thursday, we have a double whammy for you all—first we look at **Club Arciliuto** (@clubarciliuto) which is not a real club but a historic theatre, the Arciliuto Theatre, that organizes a club night every Thursday from 7:30pm (if you want to get some food first) or from 11pm till 2am if you just like to go dance and drink. This is on Piazza di Montevecchio 5, a two-minute walk from Piazza Navona. The second spot we recommend on is the more famous **Sanctuary** (@thesanctuaryecoretreat). It's been open for years but Thursday nights are still the go-to-night for this place, and the experience will not disappoint, they are open till 4am and are located on Via delle Terme di Traiano 4a.

Finally we reach the **weekend** where everyone wants to go out but now we have the opposite problem—where do we go that's not a tourist trap? Well one new spot that just opened is the **Teatro Delle Bellezze** (@teatrodellebellezze) located on Piazza dei Coronari 1. This place is open every night till 2am, there isn't much dancing going on but at the moment it's definitely the spot to check out if you enjoy good music and good drinks.

And finally, last but not least we reach **Sunday** evening. After this long week we need a night out too say goodbye to the week. We suggest you check out **Osteria Coppelle** on Piazza delle Coppelle 54, a 2-minute walk from Piazza Navona. This restaurant will organize a DJ-set every Sunday night from 8pm to 2am with a very special surprise happening at 11pm (we cannot write about it), so go check it. Uninhabitable Architecture (Architetture Inabitabili) explores the critical relationship between inhabiting and constructing. It features eight architectural structures that transcend traditional functionality. None of these structures are designed for habitation: instead, they captivate with their curious and alluring beauty.

The photographs and films featured in this exhibit portray these Italian wonders in a way that shifts perceptions away from the structures' lack of hospitality and instead highlight their enchantment.

Each architectural structure has its own narrative to accompany it. Their unique stories are revealed by eight different authors who highlight their symbolic, emotional, and

historical significance.

The **Gazometro** in Rome is a structure that bares much similarity to the structure of the Colosseum. It is the most visible structure on this list not only because of its height and proximity, but because of its presence in recent cinematography.

The **Brion Memorial** in Altiove was created as a burial place for the well-known. Brion family and designed by Carlo Scarpa.

The bell tower of **Curon** is a structure completely encompassed by Lake Resia in Trentino-Alto Adige. This structure is the only building remaining from the flooding of its entire town.

The **Cretto** di Gibellina is the last surviving structure of the earthquake that destroyed Belice in

1968. It is made of gorgeous white concrete that also incorporates the ruble of the city

The **Lingotto** in Turin, designed by Giacomo Matte Trucco, is a famous sight formerly housed the FIAT factory, making it a landmark of industrial history.

The former **Tobacco Drying Sheds** of Città di Castello has served many purposed throughout its history. It once housed and treated flood-damaged books from Florence. Then tobacco curated tobacco until it was forced to abandon the practice in the 1970s. The building has now taken on its latest purpose, the host of the last great pictorial cycles by Alberto Burri in the 90s.

The **Branca Tower,** originally known as the Littoria Tower, was designed by Gio Ponti for the purpose of housing the temporary exhibition of the 1933 Triennale. The height and location of Tower allows for a special panoramic view of Milan.

Lastly, the **Palmenti of Pietragalla** are a collection of cave-like structures that was founded around one thousand years ago. This "uninhabitable" place now hosts a beautiful fairytale-like. green landscape.

Whether you are familiar with these structures or not, there is something to be extracted from this brilliant exhibit. The meticulously captured photographs and the emotive stories that accompany them make for a fascinating tale.
